Summer: Preparing Your Application!

Plan to see your consultant often this summer - we have writing to do! (every 7-14 days or so).

Senior labs include the **Activities List, Main Essay, Common App, SRAR** and **Short Answer Questions**. You may have already attended some of these at the end of the Junior year, and they will repeat through the summer. Don't procrastinate.

		Put finishing touches on the Activities List .	
		Finalize your balanced college list of 6-8 (up to 12 with extreme reach) schools. Yes this is still changeable, but go for the final research this month (College Reasonings , anyone?).	
		If you haven't yet, attend the Main Essay Lab and Draft Essay . Plan for at least 5 hours of solid writing on the Main Essay this month. Work ahead and plan around travel .	
		If you haven't yet, attend the Common App Lab and be sure all schools are added to your CA.	
		Attend the Short Answer Questions Lab and collect your questions in one document.	
		Review Testing Plan with consultant if necessary. Decide which schools will receive your score.	
		Attend the SRAR Lab and begin working on your SRAR.	
<u>July</u>			
		Finish Main Essay. This is a top priority and will reduce stress later. Trust us!	
		Finish your 'Common App' tab (you will need parent input) and be sure all colleges are added to your CA (Screen Share with Consultant and finalize Activities List order).	
		If you haven't yet, attend the Short Answer Questions Lab and collect your questions on one document.	
		Compose your 'Why This Major' short answer question (200 words to be modified later).	
	<u>Au</u>	gust - Common App Goes Live!	
		August 1st, roll over Common App Information.	
		If you are finished with the Main Essay and Activities List, you are ready to APPLY to schools that do not have Short Answer Questions! Do appropriate happy dance.	
		Finish all Short Answer Questions. All the questions you collected can be verified and written. It's tempting to procrastinate here. Don't.	



Senior Year: Semester 1

<u>September</u>

	Request your transcripts to be sent to the colleges - ASK COUNSELOR FOR PROCEDURE AT YOUR SCHOOL.	
	Request letters of recommendation be sent to colleges - ASK COUNSELOR FOR PROCEDURE AT YOUR SCHOOL.	
	Request test scores be sent to colleges (if applicable) through ACT or College Board.	
	Finish All Short Answer Questions if you haven't already.	
	Hit submit on each college as the SAQs are approved - you're in the home stretch!	
	Begin searching for scholarships at the schools you've applied to.	
	If you apply to UT Austin, submit housing deposit through portal (other schools - wait to do this).	
Oc.	<u>tober</u>	
	If you haven't already, submit college applications by 10/01 (latest).	
	Look for portal log-in information to track each application status.	
	Verify that your colleges have received the transcripts, letters and test scores. Keep checking back every 48 hours or so to be sure.	
	Submit scholarship/honors college applications to all colleges (if applicable) and ask for writing help in advance.	
	Meet with school counselor to learn about local scholarships.	
<u>November</u>		
	Verify all honors, scholarship, merit-based applications have been received by the institutions.	
	Keep checking for local or regional scholarships.	
You	have done all you can do - take a deep breath - embrace patience.

	Have guidance counselor send first semester transcripts to schools that request it.	
	Let your consultant know as you receive any decisions!
