11th Grade Checklist



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11th Grade - Semester 1

Get a copy of your **unofficial transcript**.

This semester is about college research and identifying (or narrowing down) your major choice. This will also be a big semester for test prep, so be sure to budget your time, and be aware of registration deadlines.

	Discuss your Testing Plans with your consultant (based on practice ACT/SAT) and register before the due date.
	Seek out test prep that concludes within the week of your scheduled test.
	Plan for college visits to at least one safety, target and reach school.
	Attend college fairs whenever possible.
]	Reach out to admissions officers to ask questions. Demonstrate interest by receiving college newsletters, signing up for mailing lists, and following schools on social media.
	Identify areas of leadership within extracurricular activities.
	Attend the CAREER LAB if you haven't already and EXPLORE MAJORS of interest!
	Research colleges from your Dynamic List and begin to add them to your Balanced List where appropriate.
11 th Grade - Semester 2 Aim for narrowing down your balanced college list this semester to 6-8 schools. Plan to attend the Activities List Lab and Main Essay Lab, too! Most of the same items from Semester 1 carry over to this semester as well.	
	Meet with your college/career counselor at least once (check graduation progress and ask questions about 12th grade coursework)
	Discuss 12th grade course selection with your consultant
	Continue and revise Testing Plans
	Make summer plans that relate to your major and demonstrate academic curiosity (MOOCs, summer jobs, internships, volunteer work, classes, etc.)
	Create a Common App profile if you haven't already
	Attend the ACTIVITIES LIST LAB and begin wording for common app
	Attend MAIN ESSAY LAB and begin drafting your main essay
	Work on Brag Sheet and Expanded Resume (if applying to UT Austin)
П	In May, ask two core subject teachers for verbal commitment on letters of recommendation
